GET ON BOARD

The Government of Jamaica (GoJ), in its commitment to good governance, has established a Public Bodies Database of Prospective Directors. This is an online database meant to improve the probity, transparency and efficiency of the process of nominating, selecting and appointing to the board of Jamaica's public body. The database will contain information on persons willing to serve on public body boards, which means a due diligence check would have determined that persons possess the requisite knowledge, skills and experience to be selected and appointed to a public body board.

If you are in the database, an appointment may be made on the occurrence of certain events, including the end of board tenure or a change in a minister. The prospective director will then be shortlisted for selection by the appointing authority/minister.

WHAT YOU SHOULD REMEMBER:

- 1. Go to www.mof.gov.jm.
- 2. On the MOFPS landing page select, the "public body boards" application and create a profile.
- 3. Once completed, you will be required to read and complete the eligibility criteria which is subject to your consent to have due diligence and fit and proper check.
- 4. The first page of the application requires that you provide your demographics, business and employment history.
- 5. Remember to save and continue before moving to the next page.
- 6. On the second page of the application, insert your qualifications, professional skills, as well as your community and board involvement.
- 7. Save and continue to the third and final page of the application.
- 8. Complete the declaration, provide information on two references, attach your ID and then submit the application.



WHAT'S ?

You will be among the directory of applicants who are desirous of exercising their civic duty to serve on over 146 public body boards. The selection is based on your competency match and is open to all qualified applicants.



Public bodies are those which are defined by the Public Bodies Management and Accountability Act to be government companies and statutory bodies with body corporate status over which the Government exercises control.
