A Brief History of Open Government in Jamaica

Open Government

Open government is the governing doctrine which holds that citizens have the right to access the documents and proceedings of the government to allow for effective public oversight.

"Open Government: Collaboration, Transparency, and Participation in Practice" - Laurel Ruma, Daniel Lathrop (O'Reilly Media)

Open Government Data

Government data and information that has been created or commissioned by a public entity which is made accessible for public use and re-use.

- 1. Made available and not subjected to privacy, security or privilege limitations.
- 2. Collected at source, at the most atomic level, not in aggregate or modified norms.
- 3. Made available as quickly as possible, to preserve the value of the data, to the widest range of users for the widest range of purposes.

Open Government Data

- 4. Reasonably structured to allow automated processing.
- 5. Available to anyone with no requirement of registration and formatted so that no entity has exclusive control.
