JAMAICA AND OGP PROCESS - BACKGROUND

- In December 2016, the Government of Jamaica (GOJ) submitted to the OGP a Letter of Intent (LOI) signed by Prime Minister Andrew Holness committing to joining the OGP
- Two (2) Cabinet Decisions in June 2018 and February 2020 approved the preparation of Jamaica's National Action Plan (NAP) and establishment of a Multistakeholder Forum (MSF) in keeping with the OGP's Participation and Co-creation Standards
- Jamaica's first OGP National Action Plan (NAP) was completed and submitted in December 2021, and revised OGP NAP submitted in June 2022
- Jamaica's first OGP NAP included seven (7) commitments, in the areas of Anti-Corruption, Open Data, Access to Information, Justice and Human Rights, Environment, Climate Change and Youth

JAMAICA AND OGP PROCESS – PROGRESS REPORTS FOR FIRST OGP NAP 2022-2023

- First Progress Report on Status of Implementation of OGP NAP Commitments updated by implementing entities for the period January-December 2022 and presented to stakeholders in April 2023
- Second Progress Report on Status of Implementation of OGP NAP Commitments updated by implementing entities for the period January 2022-August 2023 and presented to stakeholders in December 2023
- The Second Progress Report on the OGP NAP 2022-2023 indicated that a majority of activities were delayed under the first action planning cycle based on the progress reporting, with a common theme of constraints in human resources and funding impacting their timely implementation

JAMAICA – SECOND OGP NATIONAL ACTION PLAN 2024-2026

- Cabinet approved the development of a second OGP National Action Plan for Jamaica, by way of a cabinet decision taken in November 2023
- The submission to Cabinet recommended that the second OGP NAP for Jamaica should be largely based on the commitments and milestone activities which remain uncompleted following the conclusion of Jamaica's first OGP NAP in August 2023, and this is the approach which was taken for the development and completion of Jamaica's second NAP
- Jamaica's second OGP NAP 2024-2026 therefore continues to include seven (7) commitments, in the areas of Anti-Corruption, Open Data, Access to Information, Justice and Human Rights, Environment, Climate Change and Youth

JAMAICA – SECOND OGP NATIONAL ACTION PLAN Revised Timelines: June 2024 - June 2026

- The Second OGP NAP was intended to be submitted by end-February 2024, to cover an implementation period from January 2024-December 2025. However, Jamaica was not able to submit its Second OGP NAP to the OGP by the end of February 2024 as planned. This was primarily due to the scheduling of local government elections on Monday, February 26, 2024, and the subsequent cancellation of the Cabinet meeting which would normally have been held on that date, and for which the Cabinet approval of the Second OGP NAP had been targeted.
- As a consequence, and in line with the advice provided from the OGP, Jamaica would aim to submit its Second OGP NAP in advance of end-August 2024, which will cover an action plan cycle from June 2024-June 2026.
- The Second OGP NAP 2024-2026 was completed in July 2024, following further meetings with stakeholder consultation groups, and submitted to Cabinet in July 2024. The Second OGP NAP 2024-2026 was resubmitted to Cabinet in September 2024 with additional information including letters of support from all implementing entities.
- The second Open Government Partnership (OGP) National Action Plan (NAP) 2024-2026 for Jamaica was approved by Cabinet by way of a cabinet decision taken in October 2024 and was formally submitted to the OGP in December 2024.

JAMAICA – SECOND OGP NAP 2024-2026 New Multi-Stakeholder Forum (MSF)

- Cabinet approved the Submission on the MSF Membership for the Second OGP NAP 2024-2026 for Jamaica, by way of decision in June 2025. Under this decision, the OGP MSF for GOJ's Second OGP NAP has an increased membership of fourteen (14), comprising seven (7) government and seven (7) civil society members.
- The government membership of the new MSF includes the MOFPS, which continues to be the lead Ministry for the OGP, along with representatives from five (5) key Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), including the main ministries responsible for implementing the GOJ's commitments in the Second OGP NAP.
- The seven (7) Civil Society members were selected through a process of nomination and selection designed and conducted by civil society stakeholders. A Selection Committee was established by the civil society members of the MSF in July 2024, and nominations were invited from civil society from persons offering to serve on the MSF for the period of the second OGP NAP. The Selection Committee reviewed the applications received and selected the seven (7) recommended civil society nominees based on a number of criteria including expertise, independence, commitment and reputation.
- The new MSF will provide oversight and guidance to the process for the implementation,
 monitoring and reporting for Jamaica's Second OGP NAP 2024-2026.

JAMAICA AND OGP PROCESS – PROGRESS REPORT FOR SECOND OGP NAP 2024-2026

- At its second meeting held on August 19, 2025, the OGP MSF agreed to commence the preparations for the first Progress Report on implementation of the Second OGP NAP 2024-2026.
- At its third meeting held on November 27, 2025, the MSF approved the first Progress Report on implementation of the Second OGP NAP 2024-2026, based on the updates received from implementing entities, and agreed to prepare for meetings with the OGP Stakeholder Consultation Groups to present and discuss the first Progress Report on the Second OGP NAP 2024-2026 for Jamaica, covering the period June 2024-June 2025.
- The first Progress Report on the Second OGP NAP indicated that progress is underway on all seven (7) commitments during the June 2024 June 2025 review period. However, a majority of activities were delayed under the second action planning cycle based on the progress reporting, with a common theme of constraints in human resources and funding impacting their timely implementation.
